**STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

On August 17, 2022, City Council approved the Multi-Jurisdictional Interlocal Contract for Traffic Signal Detection which provides funding for the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) to administer the project. The Interlocal Contract with Clark County, the cities of Las Vegas, Henderson, Boulder City, and Mesquite, and the RTC provides funding for engineering and construction to repair and replace traffic signal detection devices at various locations. The RTC administers and funds this project.

On May 17, 2023 City Council approved Supplemental No. 1 to increase construction funds for this project.

On February 7, 2024 City Council approved Supplemental No. 2 to increase construction funds for this project.

On February 21, 2024 City Council approved Supplemental No. 3 to increase construction funds for this project.

Supplemental Interlocal Contracts Nos. 4 & 5 will increase construction funds for this project to procure equipment with long lead times and to purchase and install video image detectors at intersections with faulty detection equipment, which have an impact on traffic signal operations. Supplemental Interlocal Contract No. 4 increased the funding for the project from \$4 million to \$6.5 million. Supplemental Interlocal Contract No. 5 increased the funding for the project from \$6.5 million to \$14.5 million. The RTC worked with local agencies to identify priority intersections for the new detection systems.

This project is administered and funded by the RTC.
