That City Council receive a presentation by the Clark County Regional Flood Control District and adopt the 2023 Las Vegas Valley Flood Control Master Plan Update.

STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

NRS 543.596 requires that the Flood Control Master Plan be updated every five years to add any new information relevant to the plan, to assess progress toward fulfillment of the plan during the five-year period, to identify any major obstacles to completion of the plan, and to recommend amendments to the Master Plan.

On October 13, 2022 the Regional Flood Control District (District) contracted with AtkinsRealis USA, Inc. to perform a Master Plan Update for the Las Vegas Valley (MPU). This update affects flood control facility planning in the Las Vegas Valley within the unincorporated areas of Clark County and the cities of Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, and Henderson. This study area also includes Apex to the northeast and El Dorado to the southeast of the Las Vegas Valley. This study was coordinated with representatives of the affected entities through regular progress meetings, correspondence, individual meetings and solicitation of draft review comments by the district and their consultant.

Upon their finding that the MPU is the most cost effective structural and regulatory means for correcting existing problems of flooding within the area and dealing with the probable effects of future development, the District adopted the 2023 “Flood Control Master Plan Update of the Las Vegas Valley” as an amendment to the Master Plan in accordance with NRS 543.590 on April 11, 2024.

The MPU will not become effective until it is adopted by Clark County and the cities of Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, and Henderson. North Las Vegas staff has participated in the development of the MPU and recommends approval at this time. A copy of the Final Report is attached.
