**STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The City of North Las Vegas (City) and Republic Silver State Disposal, Inc. dba Republic Services (Republic Services), the City's franchisee for solid waste collection and disposal, have negotiated an amendment to the existing franchise agreement between the City and Republic Services. One of the changes contained in the amended franchise agreement is a change to the index used to determine the rate adjustments that Republic Services implements on an annual basis for the services it provides to businesses and residents in the City. The current index used for these rate changes is the CPI-U, which is the consumer price index that reflects inflation for costs of everyday goods, such as groceries. Republic Services has proposed a change to CPI-WST, which is the CPI used for water, sewer, and trash utilities.

The City is proposing an amendment to Chapter 8.20 of the North Las Vegas Municipal Code (NLVMC) specifically to update the definition of CPI contained to refer to CPI-WST. Additionally, the amendments to NLVMC Chapter 8.20 reflect the current rates that Republic Services charges for solid waste management and removal services to the City's businesses and residents. As the amendments to NLVMC Chapter 8.20 could be considered a rule which impacts local businesses, a business impact statement has been prepared pursuant to NRS 237.080.

Ordinance No. 3231 was published on the City's website on January 30, 2025. Additionally, the City's Business License Division emailed a notification letter and proposed amendments to Title 8 to business owners, chambers of commerce, and trade associations on January 30, 2025. The City received two responses to the notification letter. In response, the City posted an informational sheet related to the amendments contained in Ordinance No. 3231. Additionally, the City reached out to the individuals who inquired about the changes

in Ordinance No. 3231 to provide further information. No significant objections or concerns were raised by the businesses who were notified of the proposed ordinance amendment. No chambers of commerce or trade associations submitted a request for a workshop. Therefore, no workshop was held pursuant to NRS 237.080(5).
