STAFF COMMENTS AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

term of the agreement to be credited to the Roadway Operations Fund.

I-15 Owner, LP, a Delaware limited partnership authorized to do business in the State of Nevada ("Permittee") owns APN 123-29-701-007, at the northeast corner of EL Campo Grande Avenue and Lamont Street. City sewer services are not available in this area. Permittee requested to build its own private sewer force main to provide sanitary sewer service to its properties as Permittee intends to develop the property soon. In order to install such sewer main, the Permittee must utilize City roadway rights-of-way as well as Union Pacific Railroad right-of-way.

The Revocable Encroachment Permit Agreement provides Permittee a permit to use the City's right-of-way for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a private sanitary sewer for the property for a 20-year term with the option to continuously extend the permit for additional 10-year terms. The permit fee is calculated in five-year intervals so that the City can recalculate the fee every five years based on assessed public property values in the area. Upon approval of this Agreement, Permittee shall pay the first five-year permit fee in the amount of \$25,916.30.
